

**To make the mask:**

1. Print out the mask on an A4 sheet of recycled paper
2. Carefully cut around the mask.
3. To make the mask more durable, you apply clear contact paper to both sides of the mask and cut around it again.
4. Attach string or elastic to the sides of the mask

**About the Numbat**

The numbat, also known as the banded anteater, is a marsupial found in Western Australia. Its diet consists almost exclusively of termites. Once widespread across southern Australia, the range is now restricted to several small colonies and it is listed as an endangered species.
